Since 2016 Common Entrance Test is applicable for LL B admissions. MH CET Cell governs the admissions. All applications should be to CET Cell. Online process for the whole state is handles by DHE, Pune through CET Cell and affirmed by the Admissions Regulatory Authority.

This is our humble effort to guide on certain frequently asked questions by candidates seeking admission-

1. Which courses are available in the college?

LL B (3 years) (6 semesters) and Certificate Programme in Animal Protection Laws

1a. How is an LL B degree useful?

To be very brief and say the least: LL B 3 years programme leads to LL B professional degree which is mandatory for practicing law in India. A world of Careers in judiciary, corporate world, public affairs, legal education etc open for law professionals.

2. Is the college approved by BCI?

Yes

3. To which University is the college affiliated to?

University of Mumbai

3a. Is the college NAAC accredited?

Yes. The college underwent first cycle in 2004 and is now in the process of second cycle NAAC Accreditation.

4. What is the eligibility criteria for admission into LL B (3 yrs) programme?

Minimum eligibility is graduation with 45% and CET non Zero score(till 2022-23)
Relaxation of 5 % is available for SC and ST. Relaxation of 3% is available for OBC, VJNT etc There is no relaxation for persons with disability.

4a. Is there an age criteria for eligibility? Is there an age bar?

The age restriction rule imposed by the BCI is challenged and the matter is pending before the Supreme Court of India. As of now there is no age bar due to stay by court.

5. Does the college have management quota/ institutional quota?

No. The management quota has been cancelled since 2016-17.

6. Is MHCET compulsory?

Yes. Any candidate who seeks admission ought to have appeared in MH common entrance test of the year for admission.

7. Is there reservation for women candidates?

Yes. There is reservation for SC< ST< OBC< VJNT< Women, Persons with disability, defence personnel etc as laid down by the MHCET cell in its admission brochure.

7a. How many seats are there?

The maximum number of seats/maximum intake capacity of the college is 264: 240+24 EBC.

7b. If there are 1 or 2 seats remaining vacant or some cancellations happen after admissions are over, can I be admitted against that seat?

After cutoff date no admissions are permitted. Further, no admissions will be done by the college except as per the process laid down by the CET cell.

8. What is CAP?

CAP is the common admission process. Government through CET cell is completely conducting the admission process right from registration, Common Entrance Test, Candidates option forms, preparation of merit lists and notification, preparation of admission schedule, provision of portal for colleges to admit-reject candidates etc.

9. What is institutional round?

In respect of our college which does not have management quota, institutional round is a misnomer. CET names the last round as institutional round. College has no authority to receive applications nor to allocate a single seat. In the institutional round also candidates have to apply online to the CET cell. We will notify selected candidates and wait list for remaining seats based on the merit list prepared and given to us by the CET

10. The CET registration fees, CET exam fees, seat allocation fees are to be paid to whom?

These are fees levied and collected by the CET cell. College has nothing to do with this.

11. When should candidates come to college for admission?

Candidates should come to college once the merit list is declared and you are allotted our college. You shall bring your allotment letter, original documents, sets of document copies and other papers as notified. You should come within the days mentioned in the schedule to claim your admission.

12. Is attendance at lectures compulsory?

By University ordinance and Bar Council of India's rules, 75% attendance is compulsory.

13. Is there internal evaluation?

Yes for every paper/course of 100 marks 25 marks is for internal evaluation. The Choice based credit system is introduced in 2019-20

14. What are the fees?

The fees of Rs 12,428/- is payable at the time of admission for first year. This includes University components, BCI components and Semester exam fees. Similar fees are payable for second year and third year respectively at the time of admission to the higher class.

15. Does the college have a hostel?

There is no hostel facility that is attached to the college. Students who require shall arrange for themselves.

16. Is scholarship available?

Scholarship of Government is available for SC ST OBC VJNT etc as allowed by Samaj Kalyan department. The application through college should be made online with necessary documents.

17. Is railway concession available?

Yes. As per age and other criteria fixed by railway concession is available in monthly and quarterly passes.

18. What is the cutoff score for admissions?

Cutoffs cannot be predicted for the following reasons-

- i) Merit list is prepared by CET
- ii) there is no passing minimum
- iii) cutoff will differ from category to category, round to round, college to college, year to year

19. Is CET score of previous year(s) valid?

No. CET cell rules require fresh CET each time for admission of that year.

20. Whom do we, candidates, contact for doubts, difficulties?

For queries, doubts consult the CET brochure. The entire admission is orchestrated by the CET cell and so contact the CET cell.

24. Whether I will get time to submit by Caste Validity certificate or Non Creamy layer certificate after admission?

College has no authority. It will be as per instructions of CET cell.

25. Will I be required to submit my original documents with the college at the time of admission?

Yes. The originals will be in college custody till ARA verifies and confirms the admissions. This may take 3-4 months.
